GRAVE PARKING PLEDGE

Steven Bate has agreed to take up a very good suggestion by some Ingthorpe residents. Many hundreds of Bispham residents take flowers to the graves of their loved ones at Carlton Cemetery. Two or three miles could be cut off the drive, with a small car park at the entrance to the Cemetery. Where Moor Park Ave meets Kincaig Road, there is an ideal patch of suitable unused ground. All it needs is £300 worth of crushed up road surfacing to make it suitable for 10 or 12 cars.

That crushing takes place 300 metres away on Bristol Ave. Plenty of people park on the roads near that roundabout & walk through to visit graves. But a basic car park would be much better. If the Council refuses to fund it after May 5th, Steven Bate has pledged to fund it from his personal council expenses.
